SESSION 1: SEARCHING FOR LIFE










Jesus Christ and his promise of life, his presence as life, is at the core of every congregation

- Adapt the organisational structure of the local church to support our goals and steps










KEY PLANNING PRINCIPLES

KEY PLANNING PRINCIPLES

- Positive principle
- Proximity principle
- Partnership principle

- Plan a Church Life Survey in the future to update and track progress

- Communicate the plan
- Celebrate the achievements
- Monitor the implementation
- Evaluate the outcomes
